

# COMMUNITY WATER SYSTEMS

## CBSP 2

Establishing community water systems in Tina catchment community offers several significant benefits such as:

### DURING PHASE 2

#### IMPROVED HEALTH



Access to clean and safe drinking water reduces the incidence of waterborne diseases.

#### ENHANCED QUALITY OF LIFE



Reliable access to water improves the overall quality of life for communities, allowing for better hygiene practices, cooking, and sanitation.

- ☑ 3 water supply schemes that were identified and assessed during the CBSP Pilot will be built during phase 2 at the cost of approximately US \$320,000 and are expected to benefit approximately 1300 people.
- ☑ **System 1** will be for the Managikiki community and Antioch community.
- ☑ **System 2** will be for river side communities near the dam including Namopila, Habusi and Valasala.
- ☑ **System 3** will be for the Vatupaua and Horohotu communities.

#### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



Improved water systems can support local agriculture, leading to better food security and economic opportunities.

#### REDUCTION OF GENDER INEQUALITY



Women and girls often bear the burden of collecting water. Access to community water systems can free up their time for education, work, and other productive activities, contributing to gender equality.

### Key achievements from the pilot phase completed in 2023

A total of 4859 people from 592 households, 8 schools and 2 clinics have benefitted from access to improved water sources.
